Dr. Marco Grados is Associate Professor of Psychiatry at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. Dr. Grados is engaged in research in the genetics of obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD) and Tourette syndrome (TS). The focus of his research is the interface of pediatric OCD with TS and ADHD from a genetic etiological perspective. Dr. Grados also maintains a psychopharmacology clinic for pediatric OCD. In addition, he is active in research in behavioral phenotypes, with a focus on repetitive behaviors in Cornelia deLange syndrome. He is also clinical director in the Division of Child & Adolescent Psychiatry at Hopkins which houses a 12-bed inpatient unit and a day hospital for children & adolescent with psychiatric disorders.
